KANSAS HEALTHY FOOD INITIATIVE (KHFI)

The Kansas Healthy Food Initiative (KHFI) aims to increase access to affordable, healthy food to improve the health and economic development of Kansans and their communities. The initiative provides technical assistance for those seeking to strengthen access to healthy foods, as well as financing through a mix of loans and grants to develop new or to renovate healthy food retail in underserved communities throughout Kansas.

RESOURCE CRITERIA

Eligible food retail projects must expand healthy food retail offerings in low-resource, underserved areas and fit local community needs. Potentially eligible projects include grocery stores, co-ops, farmers markets, production, and distribution operations.

HOW FUNDING WORKS

Loans, grants, and loan/grant mixes are available for KHFI-eligible projects. There are two types of funding available.

- Loan/grant funding mixes have 15% grant funding, with grant caps dependent on total request.
- Grant-only funding requests may be awarded for smaller requests, with a maximum of \$15,000, or as a part of a larger funding package where the grant request amount will not exceed 2% of the total project with a maximum request of \$50,000.
